




"We have a lot debris and downed trees scattered over both the East and West courses and the East course is partially under water," said Mr. Turner.

Mr. Turner is a second-generation Service's employee. His father is retired military who worked in Services during his military career, and retired to continue in that field also. Mr. Turner liked what he had been exposed to by his family and also chose the government services as a career, training as a golf manager and cross training as a club manager. He's also experienced in other Service's programs such as Outdoor Recreation, Community Centers, Lodging, and Fitness.

"I saw the Maxwell Cypress Tree Golf Course as a unique opportunity, from nine-holes to 36-holes, and the always-challenging prospect of customer participation," said Mr. Turner. "My family and I really like the South and the timing of coming

here now was quickly embraced by the whole family."

Mr. Turner is beginning to look at the Cypress Tree through a microscope, examining every aspect of the business. "We will be working on greatly increasing our Learn to Golf programs - offering more special opportunities for families, youth, and active duty customers to learn and play golf." Also creating challenging play for the active duty player, while also looking at promoting the course and what it has to offer to the entire community as a partner." Accordingly, Mr. Turner thinks they have to be more pro-active in promoting the business of fun and recreation.

The Pro Shop is another avenue that Mr. Turner thinks is ripe for promotion. "We need to add more merchandise, not only golfing merchandise, but golf accessories, apparel and gifts. There are good lines of golf related gift merchandise that would help the shop's merchandise mix and make gift buying for the golfer in the family easy and fun. We will be creating a youth and ladies section in the pro shop. We already have plans to renovate the "Two Putts Bar & Grill" serving line and are going to decorate the lounge."

The focus of the Cypress Tree is to offer the best service and product available while enhancing and improving the overall facility, according to Mr. Turner. To that end, says Mr. Turner, "we are starting a Golf Advisory Committee to help solicit feedback from the community. We will have the names of the representatives for this committee soon and hope our customers will seek them out and give them their valuable feedback to help make Cypress Tree the best golf course in the Air Force.
