## Chronology

### Edward G. Lansdale

- 1908 February 6 Born Edward Geary Lansdale in Detroit, Michigan.
- 1930 Graduated from the University of California at Los Angeles.
- 1943 Commissioned as lieutenant, US Army. Served in military intelligence for duration of war.
- 1945-1948 Transferred to Philippines, AFWESPAC. Appointed Chief of Intelligence Division. Extended stay in Philippines at AFWESPAC and PHILRYCOM; helped Philippine Army rebuild its Intelligence Services.
- 1947 Commissioned as a captain in the Regular Air Force, temporary rank of major.
- 1949 Temporary promotion to lieutenant colonel; Instructor, Strategic Intelligence School, Lowry Air Force Base, Colorado.
- 1950 At the request of President Elpidio Quirino, transferred to JUSMAG in the Philippines to advise Philippine Army Intelligence Services in fight against the Huks. Met Ramon Magsaysay, Philippine Secretary of National Defense; became close friends. Assisted in development of psychological operations, civic actions, rehabilitation of Huk prisoners, and other programs.
- 1951 Temporary promotion to colonel.
- 1953 Member of General John. W. "Iron Mike" O'Daniel's mission to the French forces in Indochina; acted as an advisor on special counter guerrilla operations.
- 1954-1956 Transferred to Saigon, served with MAAG-Vietnam until end of 1956. Helped advise Vietnamese government and armed forces on problems of internal security, including pacification program (1954-55), psychological operations, intelligence, and integration of sect armies. Became close associate of President Ngo Dinh Diem.
- 1957 Went to office of the Secretary of Defense, Washington; became Deputy Assistant to the Secretary for special operations.

- 1959 Staff member of President's Committee on Military Assistance (Draper Committee).
- 1960 Temporary promotion to brigadier general.
- 1961 Became Assistant to the Secretary of Defense for Special Operations.
- 1963 Temporary promotion to major general.
- 1963 October 31 Retired; awarded Distinguished Service Medal (second time) for counter-insurgency work. Became consultant to director of Food for Peace, White House.
- 1965-1967 Returned to South Vietnam as Senior Liaison Officer of the US Mission to South Vietnam under Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge. Appointed Minister in March 1966 by President Johnson. Staff became the "Senior Liaison Office" (SLO). Work involved winning support in Vietnamese countryside.
- 1967-1968 Assistant to Ambassador Ellsworth Bunker, US Mission to South Vietnam.
- 1972 Publication of In The Midst Of Wars (memoirs).
- 1987 February 23 Died of heart ailment at his home in McLean, Virginia.

THE PERSONAL LIBRARY



When Major General Edward G. Lansdale died in February 1987 at the age of 79 most of his papers (correspondence, diaries, speeches, and writings) had long since been deposited in the Hoover Institution Archives at Stanford University. His own personal library, however, remained in his McLean, Virginia, residence. In November, 1988, his widow, Mrs Patrocinio Y. Lansdale, offered the books (and other Lansdale memorabilia) to the Air University Library. Because of General Lansdale's personal stature and his contributions to the doctrine of wars of national liberation her kind offer was accepted.

The collection is notable for many reasons. It reveals that General Lansdale read widely from his earliest days as a military officer. It shows that he had a lifelong interest in the history, folkways, and folklore of the peoples of Southeast Asia, especially his beloved Philippines and Vietnam. And it demonstrates that he was a close friend of dozens of men and women who wrote many of the books that filled the shelves of his ample collection, for volume after volume is inscribed by the author to Lansdale.

There is more than a handful of unusual pieces in this collection, but most noteworthy are the guestbooks from Lansdale's house at 194 Cong Ly in Saigon for the years 1965-67, the period when he was Senior Liaison Officer (with the rank of Minister) of the US Mission to South Vietnam, and 1967-68 when he served as assistant to Ambassador Ellsworth Bunker. Page upon page of these fire-singed, water-stained books (much of the collection was damaged during a house fire in the 70s) is filled with greetings and comments by many of the well-known actors in that dramatic confrontation of two great political forces. Side by side again in these volumes are Richard M. Nixon, Henry A. Kissinger, John Paul Vann, Daniel Ellsberg, Bui Diem, Robert Komer, Nguyen Cao Ky, Harry Reasoner, Roger Hilsman, Barry Zorthian, and many others--familiar names all, caught in a time warp by a man who believed that if enough of the right people could be brought face to face and got talking, a way through or out of the quagmire could be found.

The Lansdale library, located in the Air University Room, has been kept intact for what we believe are practical purposes. First, it honors the memory of a man who served his country throughout his lifetime. Second, it reflects the inner man and reveals some of the intellectual forces that molded him. Third, it may serve as a model for today's officer who wishes to examine the reading habits of a contemporary military leader. And finally it shows that he shared a characteristic common to modern man: utter humility in the presence of another person's writings. He respected the written word and treasured the friendship of the writer.

## Scope Note

The Lansdale collection in the Air University Library consists primarily of items from General Lansdale's own personal library. However, it also contains seven document boxes of his personal papers, drawn exclusively from the post-World War II period. This collection is overshadowed by the extensive holdings of the general's papers at the Hoover Institution, but it is ample enough to hint at the man, his ideals, passions, beliefs, and concerns.

During World War II General Lansdale served with the Office of Strategic Services. He was commissioned as a lieutenant in the US Army in 1943 and served in the Philippines Ryukyus Command during 1945-1948. He was commissioned a captain in the regular Air Force in 1947, served briefly as an instructor at the Strategic Intelligence School, Lowry Air Force Base, Colorado, during 1949, and in 1950, at the personal request of President Elpidio Quirino, was transferred back to the Philippines. Assigned to the Joint US Military Advisory Group, he served as liaison officer to Secretary of Defense Ramon Magsaysay. In 1953 he accompanied General J. W. "Iron Mike" McDaniel on his advisory mission to the French forces in Vietnam, serving as an advisor on counter guerrilla operations. In 1954-1956 he was assigned to MAAG-Vietnam, during which time he enjoyed the privilege of close association with President Ngo Dinh Diem and other Vietnamese leaders. During 1957, after brief staff duty at HQ USAF, he was transferred in June to the Office of the Secretary of Defense with duties as Deputy Assistant to the Secretary of Defense for Special Operations. In 1959 he served on the staff of the President's Committee on Military Assistance (the Draper Committee), and on 24 February 1961 he was appointed assistant to the Secretary of Defense. General Lansdale retired on 31 October 1963 and became a consultant to the Director of the Food for Peace program in the White House. He returned to Vietnam in 1965 as assistant to Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge in charge of the Special Liaison Office at the US Embassy-Saigon. He served in the rank of Minister from 17 March 1966 until June of 1968, when he returned to the United States. His memoirs, In the Midst of Wars, were published by Harper & Row in 1972.

The papers consist of a biographical file, a correspondence file, a photo file, a subject file, and a speeches and writings file. Each file represents fragments rather than the full record of a long career. What comes through most clearly is Lansdale's abiding interest in the people of Southeast Asia, and the intense loyalty of friends the world over for this unusual man.
