Colonel **Steven P. Winklmann** is the **Vice Commander, Jeanne M. Holm Center for Officer Accessions and Citizen Development**, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala. The Holm Center provides command and oversight for approximately 16,000 cadets in the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program and 1,900 students in Officer Training School. Additionally, the Holm Center trains nearly 70 percent of line, chaplain, judge advocate, nurse, medical service and biomedical science officer production for the Air Force. The center also provides oversight for the Air Force Junior ROTC program at more than 884 locations, with more than 119,000 cadets, and Civil Air Patrol, the Air Force's official auxiliary.



Colonel Winklmann was commissioned in 1985 from Norwich University, Northfield, Vt. As a force support officer, he has held a variety of base, major command and staff positions, including vice commander of the 99th Air Base Wing, Nellis AFB, Nev., director of support for the Holm Center and chief of manpower requirements division at Headquarters U.S. Special Operations Command, MacDill AFB, Fla. He has served at the base level as commander of the 354th Services Squadron, Eielson AFB, Alaska, and commander of the 405th Expeditionary Services Squadron in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. His assignments at various major commands include serving in Air Combat Command, Pacific Air Forces, U.S. Air Forces in Europe, Air Education and Training Command, Air University and Air Force Logistics Command.
